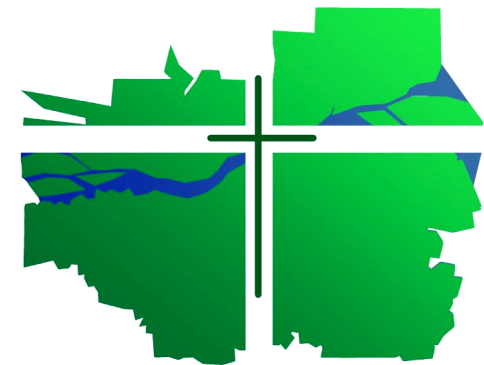

### A Verse To Think About:

*“He looked up and said, ‘I see people; they look like trees walking around.’”—Mark 8:24*

Jesus usually healed people immediately. After Jesus spit on and touched the man's eyes, He asked him if he could see. The man gave the above answer. Jesus touched him again and he was healed. Why two parts? I usually say Jesus was testing the man's faith. Creation Moments brings a very interesting perspective to this account. People wouldn't have known this at that time, but with modern medicine, when people receive their sight they often suffer from a condition known as agnosia. They can see but their brains have not yet developed the connections necessary to interpret what they are seeing. Their responses are exactly like the man in Mark. Over time correct connections form and they can see properly. So according to Creation Moments, Jesus performed two miracles. The account is medically accurate!—Albert Heal
