

Upcoming Sermons

This morning, Pastor Chris will be looking at Matthew 7:1-6 on the topic of judging others.

Today we are going to look at Jesus' words about judging others. To judge, or not to judge? That is the question. As Jesus moves towards the end of his Sermon on the Mount, this teaching is placed there intentionally. As we reflect on all that Jesus has taught us so far about the kind of people we are to be in His Kingdom, to Love God and our neighbor, he challenges us to not judge, or we ourselves will be judged. We are quick to point out the flaws, mistakes, and sins of others, but are we honestly assessing ourselves in the same way? We see to have vision problems in our ability to see our own faults compared to our ability to point out others. Jesus sees this as deeply problematic in His Kingdom, and not the way His disciples are intended to live among each other. What kind of vision should we have, and what does it look like to judge correctly?

Next Week, we welcome Akeem Adepoju to the pulpit. He will be preaching on Matthew 28: 18-20 and Mark 16: 15-20—The answer to “Thy Kingdom Come...”

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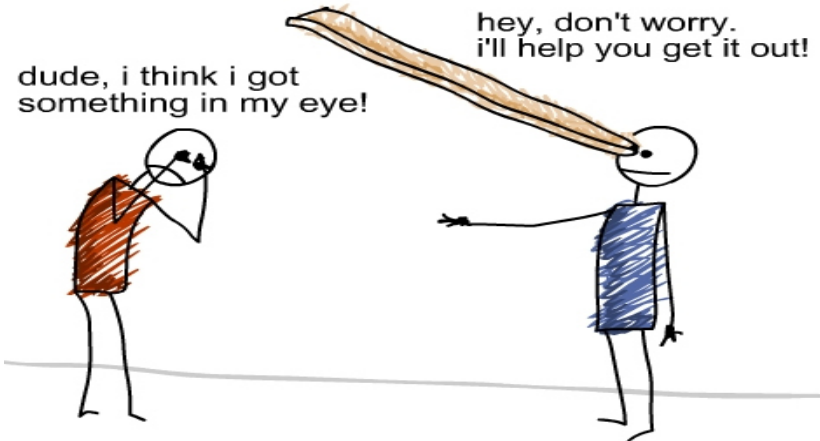
