This week, we will be looking at Philippians 2:1-11. During the week of Serve, one passage that was constantly on the mind was this section in Philippians. Paul here speaks about what true service looks like, modeled by Jesus. He exhorts the Philippian church to have the same mindset, the same character as the great Servant. He then reflects on an early church song that shows how Jesus is the ultimate Servant. As we explore this passage, we will see how service, lowering ourselves in self-sacrificial love, is not only our calling, but what it truly means to be human, as this is the very character of God.

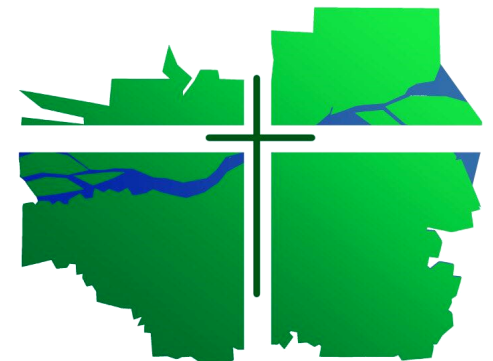

A Verse To Think About

"There are six things that the Lord hates, seven things detestable to him: snobbish eyes, a lying tongue, hands that spill innocent blood, a heart set on wicked plans, feet that run quickly to evil, a false witness who breathes lies, and one who causes conflicts among relatives." Proverbs 6:16-19

Passages like this, Romans 1:26-31, Gal 5:19-21 and 2 Cor 12:19-21 remind us that a Godly life is not only avoiding things like spilling innocent blood or wicked plans. It is also avoiding the other things, like having a bad attitude (snobbish eyes), being truthful (lying tongue), sharing false information (false witness who breathes lies), causing conflict. Or like in the other passages: gossiping, not obeying our parents, being jealous, envy, selfish ambition, hatred... the list goes on. We sometimes focus on the items that are issues for other people and ignore those that might be issues for ourselves. The sermon on the mount also points us to a higher standard - reminding us that what is in our heart matters, not only what we do. It isn't enough to be a Christian by the grit of our teeth. We need to be changed from the inside by the Holy Spirit so our fruit will be good fruit. (Galatians 5:22-23)
